ICE ACTIVITY IN NASHVILLE

In the five days after the May 9th ICE activity, TIRRC fielded over1000 phone calls through their legal resource line. 75% of the calls were related to this immigration enforcement activity. At that time they scoured records and identified 68 people who were detained. TIRRC is focused on ensuring that every person impacted has their fair day in court and that families can be reunited as soon as possible. If you or a family member have been affected by this immigration enforcement operation, call the TIRRC resource line at 615-414-1030 and visit their Know Your Rights page for legal information and resources.

If you are looking to support the families affected by these sweeps, consider donating

to the recently launched Belonging Fund through the Community Foundation of Middle Tennessee. One hundred percent of this fund will go directly to supporting immigrant families in times of crisis. Already, more than \$32,000 has been distributed to immigrant families affected by the recent immigration enforcement to help pay for essentials like groceries, diapers, and rent. This fund has already raised over \$200,000.

In addition, USAHello offers free online classes for GED/HiSET and citizenship preparation and practice tests, and information for immigrants on living in the USA including money, employment and more.
